

## 5. Open Session for Members of the Public:

Issues regarding speeding and road safety on both Station Road and Smite Lane were discussed at length. MOPs felt that nothing is being done by NCC/Via in spite of several accidents (including 1 fatality on Breedon's Corner) and the safety campaign undertaken by Bob Clark & OPC. It was suggested that the police should monitor more regularly as a deterrent. SP stated that he understood the issues and would check to see if this was possible. He also agreed to contact VIA and update GM before the next meeting which he is unable to attend. GM/HB agreed to collate a list of all accidents in the village to send to him. AP suggested a reminder to villagers about safe driving.

- c) Village Maintenance (PB) Would like to get quotes for the replacement of the circular seat on Hill Top. All present agreed. The memorial on Loughbon needs updating, the Grafters will look at ways to improve this area. Parking on the verge in front of the Church is becoming a problem, PB will look at signage solutions for this. The renovation of the Gibson Bridge and development of the spa will be next on the Grafter's list.
- d) **Community Flood Signage Scheme update(HB)** HB, Will Gunn & Dez Wakefield attended training for 2 hours on the 7<sup>th</sup> June. Paul Robinson has agreed to help with this
